St. James Town | CT 0065.01 & 0065.02 | May 2023

The following provides an overview of neighbourhood assets and potential barriers/gaps for older adults. The features were identified through a structured assessment in May 2023. As such, this summary should be viewed as an overview of key features observed rather than an exhaustive list.


A large proportion of the St. James Town neighbourhood appeared to be residential. Specifically, housing mainly consisted of several aged apartment buildings that are clustered within a small radius. Within a pocket of the neighbourhood, there was a hub of apartment buildings and at the heart was an elementary school with an attached childcare centre. There also appeared to be many traffic signs to promote safety for children and families. There were a small number of newer condominium buildings with retails shops on the ground floor along Sherbourne Street. Further, along Wellesley Street, there was a construction site that was advertised to be building a new condominium. Although the main mode of transportation appeared to be walking, major bus routes ran along the main roads that bordered St. James Town. Further, a major subway line was accessible at the corner of Sherbourne Street and Bloor Street East.

Although there were large green spaces directly outside of the neighbourhood along Bloor Street East and Parliament Street, there was only one small green space, St. James Town West Park. The main roads along the boundaries of the neighbourhood were busy with car traffic while the residential streets had very few cars and most people observed to be walking. While there were no private fitness centres or programs noted, the focus in the neighbourhood was the Wellesley Community Centre, run by the City of Toronto. It appeared to be a community hub that includes, but is not limited to, weight rooms, a gymnasium, fitness programs, swimming, several sport leagues. The neighbourhood appeared to be ethnically and linguistically diverse, as many of the program advertised by the Community Centre were translated in multiple languages. Further, people walking in the public buildings and streets were mainly visible minorities.

St. James Town had two places of worship: the Church of St. Peter and St. Simon Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. There were few retails shops and services within the boundaries. Notably, there are two discount grocery stores (i.e., No Frills and Food Basics), and some convenience stores and fast-food restaurants. Behind the community centre, there also appeared to be a local hub that consisted of street vendors selling a number of different items. There were several social support services, such as the Fred Victor St. James Outreach Program, Lourdes Food Bank, St. James Town Community Corner, and those offered by the Wellesley Community Center. However, there were few health clinics and services within the neighbourhood. For older adults or people with disabilities, limited availability of health services within the community may act as a barrier to access necessary health care.

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Map of services identified in St. James Town




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
